January 16, 2004
Meeting with Corrie Development

Proceedings:

- 1. Introductions
 - Each person introduces themselves.
- 2. Discussion

Mr. Corrie stated that the proposed cemetery plan has gone through five different versions. Mr. Corrie is not interested in having partners; the cemetery will be a for-profit venture.

Discussion on how many cemeteries the Tri-Valley could sustain and still be economically viable. Some thought that there was only enough room for one cemetery in the Valley while others disagreed and thought more than one could be supported.

Mr. Mallon gave a brief background on trends affecting cemeteries, including that there would be a 20-year flat death rate and then the death rate would probably spike up with the boomers. Also, the trend is toward more cremation burials and ash scattering, which don't cost as much as standard burials. Revenue from single burials is \$5,000 to \$8,000 while for cremations it is \$3,000 to \$5,000. In his opinion, more than one Tri-Valley cemetery would not be economically viable.

Mr. Corrie and his consultants gave some specifics on the cemetery proposal outlined below:

- 40 acres are developable.
- There is a creek bed, which is environmentally sensitive.
- Anticipating developing up to 66,000 single depth burials (132,000 double burials) and 200,000 cremation burials.
- They submitted a pre-application to the Contra Costa County Planning
 Department and have received preliminary comments on the proposal. They
 have revised and fine-tuned the plan according to the comments they received
 from the County.
- Haven't determined the level of environmental review that will be required.
- Cemetery will be non-denominational.
- Cemetery will be for-profit and has in-house investors only.

- They want to have the entire cemetery approved up front. They do not want to have to renew Conditional Use Permit approvals over time as they develop the cemetery.
- The cemetery will have phased development with the lower portions being developed first.
- Significant upfront, capital expenditures will be undertaken to put in the necessary infrastructure: they will pre-bury vaults and spend money for buildings and an entry way. They are considering whether to build a crematorium.
- They believe they will have enough water to serve the cemetery from an
 underground aquifer. They will incorporate bioswales on the site. Runoff will
 go to the low end of the site and the water will be reclaimed for irrigation.
- They believe the County's planning review process will take approximately 12 to 18 months and then they will be able to begin development.

3. Misc. Questions

Ms. McCormick asked if Corrie Development had support from the Contra Costa's Board of Supervisors for the proposal.

• Corrie Development said they had already talked to 4 Supervisors and they did not voice any opposition to their proposal. Mr. Corrie noted that the proposal had support from Millie Greenberg.

Some members of the Tri-Valley Cemetery Committee asked what they could do to support the proposal.

 Corrie Development said they would like to have a letter of support from the Committee and/or a letter of support from each city represented by the Committee.

4. Next steps

- Corrie Development to send an information packet to each of the members of the TriValley Cemetery Committee.
- The TriValley Cemetery Committee will schedule a meeting to discuss the Corrie Development Cemetery proposal when they receive the packets.
